





#### 1. Confirm the profile is a reasonable match



How do the details line up with what you already know?


- Names
- Age
- Birthplace or place of residence
- Relationships

#### 2. Rule out impossibilities

Did the other user make common genealogy errors, such as:

- Children born before parents
- Mothers giving birth too young or too old
- People living in two places at once





Screenshot for FamilySearch Family Tree; the exclamation icon indicates the Tree has identified a data error


#### 3. Look for citations



Did the other user cite sources at all?

Quality > quantity

Discount sources that are other family trees.

#### 4. Review linked sources



Does the source actually say what the other user says it does?

- Indexing errors
- Omissions
- Misunderstandings
- Handwriting


#### 5. Make a decision



Did the other user provide enough evidence?

Add only information that you can verify.

Attach the source/record itself, not the profile.



Screenshot of MyHeritage Smart Match "extract information" tool




#### **BONUS: Suggest edits**



Ancestry and MyHeritage Message the other user to present evidence

FamilySearch
Edit the fact directly, and add reasoning
