WHO IS THIS FOR?

This presentation could be relevant to anyone with:

- * Family rumours of someone who moved to Australia
- * Has a gap in the chronology of an ancestor's life
- * Has a branch of family who disappear from the records in a location

WHY MIGHT AUSTRALIA BE THE ANSWER?

In significant periods of global population movement in modern history, people were moving to and from Australia despite it being a remote location.

- * Australia has a mostly immigrant population.
 - While for much of its history immigration was dominated by migrants from the United Kingdom, the Australian population hails from all regions of the world
 - Immigration to modern Australia (or the Australian Colonies before 1901) has occurred in waves mostly corresponding with international waves of population movement between 1788 and today
 - Movement to Australia was both voluntary and forced, via immigration schemes, as convicts, refugees or free settlers.
- People passing through Australia
 - o Shipping provided links to Australia
 - routes inc. Orient Line, the Great Circle
 - ship's deserters

- o Emigration from Australia, especially during the Gold Rush
 - Places of destination
- There are many other reasons why people pass through Australia and may be located in our records, for example as prisoners of war or as military service personnel

THE RECORDS

NATURALIZATION/NATURALISATION AND CITIZENSHIP

- * Note the spelling naturalization vs naturalisation
- * 'Alien' (non- British subjects)
- * Naturalization is not compulsory but is required for
 - o Voting
 - o Member of parliament
 - o Own freehold land
- * Naturalization records include:
 - o Birth date and place
 - o Place of origin
 - o Ship name
 - o Date and port of arrival and
 - o Sometimes a photograph

* Citizenship

- o On January 26, 1949 the Nationality and Citizenship Act 1948 came into effect
- o First official Australian citizenship established
- Automatic Citizenship for
 - Australian-born individuals
 - British subjects residing in Australia for 5+ years
- o Naturalization Process:
 - Immigrants could apply for citizenship
 - Specific residency requirements must be met
- Australians remained British subjects until 1984

- Australian citizens were no longer British subjects
- o Citizenship records include:
 - Date of arrival in Australia
 - Ship or flight travelled on
 - Town and country of birth
 - Names of other family members
 - Education
 - Profession
 - Address in Australia at the time of naturalisation

TROVE - Newspapers and much more

- * TROVE is a free, central website to access the collections of Australian libraries, universities, museums, galleries and archives
- * Promotes access to their digital collections, of over 14 billion items
- * Particularly useful for genealogists: newspapers, Government Gazettes, maps, magazines and newsletters, pictures, photographs, and archived websites
- * Accessed via https://trove.nla.gov.au/
 - o Newspapers:
 - Over 1000 papers from around Australia (and some international)
 - focuses on digitising newspapers published before 1955
 - Shipping News, Missing People, Family Notices obituaries
 - o Gazettes:
 - Government information
 - Employees, promotions, professional registers, legal notices, tenders and contracts

HOSPITAL RECORDS @ GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY OF VICTORIA

- * GIN (Genealogical Names Index) has 446,943 indexed records from Victorian hospitals:
 - o Melbourne
 - o Amherst
 - o Ballarat
 - o Castlemaine Benevolent Asylum & Mt Alexander
 - o Dunolly
 - o Kyneton
 - o Kew Asylum
 - o Maldon
 - o Maryborough
- * Some records start from 1855 & cover Melbourne & the Goldfields area.

- * Information included:
 - o Name
 - o Age
 - o Occupation
 - o Date of admission and /or discharge from hospital
 - o Result of admission eg. cured, died and more
 - o Doctor
 - o Often with additional notes such as example
 - o Source reference to locate the original document

WILLS AND PROBATE

- * If a person lived overseas and had property in Australia then probate will be registered in the State where they lived.
- * Available in State based archives
- * When a person leaves assets in more than one state or territory, it may be necessary to register the probate in more than one location.
