

Chinese Jiapu: The Key Record for Chinese Ancestral Research

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Chinese Names – The most important name first, family name. Given names may be characteristics that the family hopes the child will possess. In male names, one of the given names may be a generational name.

Chinese Dates – Largest to smallest, year, month, date, hour.

- Year 年 nián
- Month 月yuè
- Date 目 rì
- Hour 時 shí

Example: 一九八五年 十月 二十四日 (1985 October 24)

Historic dates used the Sexagenary cycle which combines a character from the 10 Heavenly Stems and a character from the 12 Earthly Branches to signify a year in the 60 year cycle. Earthly Branches are used to denote a 2-hour time period in the day.

Chinese Places – Largest to smallest, country, province, county, municipality, city, village or hamlet.

- Country 國 国 guó
- Province 省 shěng 州 zhōu
- County 县 xiàn
- Municipality 城 chéng
- City 市 shì
- Village or hamlet 村 cūn

What is a Jiapu - A Chinese family record book that documents a family's ancestry. It documents the origins of the surname, the migration patterns of the clan, the family lineage, the ancestral biography, the story of the locality.

A Chinese Jiapu was created from a long scroll of paper. The paper was then folded into accordion pages and bound on one side to create a book. The book is read from Right to left and top to bottom.

Cover & Title Page – Family Name, Location of Clan, Year Revised.

Contents of a Jiapu – Preface/introduction, First Ancestor biography, migration, family rules, portraits of ancestors, maps, record of merits, honors, achievements, generation poem, genealogical charts and generational biographies, and more.

Different Styles of Jiapu:

- Su Style 蘇式 (Hanging Pearl) Has Connecting Lines, Generations Hang Vertically
- Ou Yang Style 歐陽式 Horizontal, 5 generations per page, Right to Left
- Imperial Style 牒記式 Vertical, Generations at the top, Right to Left
- Pagoda Style 宝 塔 式 Vertical Descendant Chart with Lines, no biographical info.
- Document Style 牒 记 式 Paragraph form

To search for a Jiapu you will need to pieces of information:


- Family Name Character
- Ancestral Village Name


