

Records from 1560 to 1900


Minutes of regular meetings

Concerns about the morality of the congregation

Spiritual needs of the congregation

Management of local education before 1872

Administration of poor relief before 1845

WHAT THE EXTRACT TELLS US

Who was the father of Marion Barrowman's son

Where she lived

Where he came from (his parish) and who his father was

The occupation of John McGregor and his father.

CHALLENGES

No indexing or searching by name

Time consuming to search if you are looking for specific people

Only covers Church of Scotland, though this can include its various schisms in the nineteenth century

The quality of the handwriting can be variable, some are difficult to read

The quantity and standard of the minutes is also variable

Not all records exist and of those that do not all are online

WHAT INFORMATION CAN YOU EXPECT TO FIND?

Ordinary people

Families prior to the census and state registration of births, marriages and deaths

The fathers of illegitimate children

People claiming poor relief

The people who were involved in the church and community

Ministers, members of the kirk session and teachers




HOW TO FIND STORIES

- First locate the parish and be aware that some parishes had more than one church
- Find the volume with the date range you are interested in
- Then scan read through the entries
- Some have 'indexes' in the margins, which can be useful if you are following a story about an individual as these are often spread over a period of time.

WHERE TO ACCESS THE MINUTES

- You can view most but not all kirk session records on Virtual Volumes on Scotland's people's website
- Those not available online can be viewed at National Records Of Scotland in Edinburgh

Search record creators >




Place search






