




Definitions Japanese family history – family history of non-Japanese nationals tracing back to ancestral Japan




Definitions

Koseki – Japanese family registers

- Fundamental starting point of all Japanese family history
- Kept at the household level
- Not available to general public; must have a direct relationship (biological or adoptive) to request



- Communication with potential relatives



- Simple English



Time Challenges

- Passage of time
- Passing of issei

 (1st) and nisei
 (2nd) generations
- Lost memories
- Mandated koseki storage periods



Time Solutions

- Talk with oldest relatives immediately
- Request koseki as soon as possible
