Introduction

Step 1 – Collect

- What notes do you have?
- What notes are missing?
- What classes stood out? Why?
- What didn't stand out?
- What ideas did you have?
- What were you inspired to do differently?

Step 2 - Reflect

Review your notes.

- Why did those things stand out?
- What connections did you make that you would like to continue?
- What insights can you glean about your family history research?
- What do you wish you could have done differently at this conference?
 - What do you need to do to start making those changes now?

Step 3 - Organize

- Create a new document or section of your notes
- Organize by actionability or categories
 - Quick tasks
 - Ideas to Explore
 - Insights

Step 4 – Strategize

To make those ideas happen:

- Who do you need to talk to?
- What questions are you exploring?
- What data do you need to gather to move forward?
- What time do you need to yourself?
