NOTE:

All our courses are written in English. However, to honor the authentic language of both the author and the country of study, students will experience spellings true to the country of origin. For example, our Australian, Canadian, Irish, and UK courses purposefully utilize the Anglicized spellings while American courses use the Americanized spellings. As an example, the Anglicized word "colour" is the correct equivalent for the American word "color." The records, documents, and books you'll be reading will use various dialects and spellings. When you're researching, immersing in unfamiliar spellings now will help you later.

Courses may be taken on an individual basis or toward certification. The system remembers every course, crediting it toward certificates at any level.
