Why use a research log?

- Record and Plan Research
- Avoid Duplication
- Document Sources
- Organize Evidence
- Evaluate Evidence

What to include?

- Date
- Purpose of Search
- Summary of Findings
- Personal Notes
- Comments on Discrepancies
- Allows you to see a whole family view
- Breaks down the specifics by individual
- Includes every record and citation for sources found
- Gives you a broad view of your descendancy
- · Brief overview of your direct line
- Research Log Generator
- Citations
- Abstracts
- Locality Research
- Cloud Access
- More Genealogical Tools!

Things to Include:

- Who is the record about
- · What is the record of
- When did the event/record take place
- Where did it happen
- Wherein the record collection/book/file is the document kept

Ouestions to Ask Yourself:

- Can the citation get you back to the original record easily?
- Is the style consistent throughout the research session?
- Does it have all the necessary elements? (Who, What, When, Where, Wherein)

- Always cite your sources
- Review and update your shared information periodically
- Embrace technology

- Easy access for editing and updating source information
- · Organize sources into folders
- · Attach sources to multiple FamilySearch profiles

FAMILYSEARCH NOTES Ask yourself the following questions when leaving notes on FamilySearch

- How do I know this information is correct?
- · What questions might somebody else have?
- Are there any contradictions that I should explain?
- Is my reason statement clear and concise?
- Is my tone professional and calm?
