
## **Family History Activities**

FamilySearch activities are simple and fun. Activities are a great way to help youth and children understand more about their heritage and family. Most require no research time or skills.

Some activities draw from the ancestor information for you in Family Tree, when you're signed in to FamilySearch. The results of these activities can change each time that you try them, as users add new information to Family Tree.

These are some of the activities in the Family History Activities page:






At the top of the FamilySearch home page, click **Activities** and then click the activity that you want to do, such as:

## You and your Stories

- Together (App developed to help bring living family closer together.)
- Where Am I From? (Check your Generations, Family Lines, Heritage and Timeline)
- All About Me (Check what was happening on the year you were born)
- Famous Relatives (Check if you're related to any Famous People)
- **Compare-a-Face** (Compare your face to your relatives' faces and see whom you most resemble.)
- Record My Story (Add Goals and Accomplishments, Heart and Soul, Fun and Entertaining, Ponder and Reflect, Spiritual, General Questions, Family Stories, Record with Friends and Create your own Stories.)
- Picture My Heritage (See where your last name is found in the FamilySearch shared tree and picture yourself in typical country costumes.)
- In-Home Activities (Activities to help you discover who you are, discover, gather, and connect your family, both the living and those who have passed on. They can be done alone or with friends and family.)






## All about your ancestors

- 2024 Year in Review (Discover the impact you and other users had this year on building the worldwide family tree.)
- **Ancestor Challenge** (Keep the memory of your ancestors alive. See how much you know them.
- Challenging Times (Know of the World Key events that occur in your ancestor's live time.)
- **Global Record Hints** (help build the tree by reviewing the high-quality hints)
- Infographic (See common details and averages in your Tree.)
- My Connections (See Which Famous Person is Most Like You!)
- My Look-Alikes (Find Out Who You Look Like!)



- Photo Collage Maker (Create your own photo collage from our collection of designed templates)
- **Record Hints** (Check if these records mention your relatives)
- Religious Records (Discover Your Ancestors in Religious Records)
- **Top Contributors** (Meet the top contributors in your part of the Tree.)
- Your ancestor's Marriage (A Match Made in...)
- Your Female Ancestor Photos (Honor the mothers in your family!)
- Your Female Ancestor's Stories (Tell the Story of Your Female Ancestors)

  - Apple iOS: In the bottom-right corner, tap More.





### **New Family History Discovery Experiences**

## Where does the information on discovery pages come from?

Information on discovery pages comes from the FamilySearch Family Tree, which is a massive database of genealogical information that FamilySearch users add to the database. This collection of names, places, dates, and memories combine to make the discovery pages.

The discovery pages are accessible through search engines, which allows people unfamiliar with FamilySearch to potentially find their ancestors. This invites more people to come and add the stories of their ancestors to the Family Tree.

## Can I find my living family in Family Tree discovery pages?

In order to protect privacy, living people in Family Tree do not have discovery pages. In Family Tree, information about living people is visible only to the user who added it. That user must sign in to Family Tree to see the information.

## FamilySearch Campaigns and Notifications

FamilySearch occasionally sends you an email to let you know about a particular discovery activity available to you on the website, if you have the option turned on for receiving FamilySearch emails in your **Notifications Settings**.


Campaigns are posted to your account as "**Notifications**" so that you can refer to them later.

If you want to find information regarding a past email, check your **Notifications**. Steps (website)

- 1. While you are signed in to FamilySearch, click the **Notifications** icon (looks like a bell), right next to your name in the upper right corner.
- 2. The **Notifications** page appears. Notifications are divided into several categories. Most notifications about activities are available under **Discoveries**.



- Click Discoveries.
- 4. The column on the left shows the titles of recent discovery notifications. Click the notification that you want to read.
- 5. The notification's content or message appears on the right.
- 6. To read a different notification, click a different title from the column on the left.
- Note: If you do not see the notification that you are looking for, search for it in **Activities** at https://www.familysearch.org/discovery/ .



## **Create Discovery Experiences with the Planner**

The **Planner** displays the information in Family Tree for the person you are helping. You can use this information to create a personalized experience and customize your lesson.


The **Planner** is available in Spanish, Portuguese, French, German, Italian, Russian, Traditional Chinese, Korean, and Japanese.



## Steps (website)

- 1. Sign in to <u>FamilySearch.orq</u>
- 2. In the upper-right, click the question mark icon.
- 3. Click **Helper Resources**.
- 4. On the right, find the **Planner**.
- 5. Click a name on the list.
- 6. On the left side, click **View Tree**.

In the **Planner**, you can switch between the fan chart, landscape view, portrait view, and descendancy views.



## What is the purpose of discovery pages in Family Tree?

The purpose of discovery pages is to provide a simpler view for the person page in Family Tree. Information is easier to see and easier to find using search engines.

The discovery page also presents the information in an interesting and engaging way to make it more relevant for new users of FamilySearch.



The discovery page is similar to the **About** tab on a person page. A person without a FamilySearch account can see the discovery page. But the discovery page takes longer to update than the **About** tab. To see the **About** tab, a person must have a FamilySearch account. When information about the person changes, the **About** tab updates immediately.

Go to one of your **Ancestor's Details** page and then click the **About** Page

You can now find some discovery experiences in your ancestor's **About** page.

Depending on the information you've added to the Family Tree, you can view **Photos and Memories**, check **Parents and Siblings**, **Spouses and Children**. You can explore their heritage by viewing the **Brief Life History**, and even see the **Name Meaning**, all in one place.
