




Me and Ramona Quimby




Ramona was right, squeezing the toothpaste was awesome!

My dad must have heard my squeals of joy, and as my parent with a toddler knows, silence or maniacal laughing deserves a double time speed walk to the source of the sound. Somehow he managed to grab a camera and capture the moment.
